# Tic-Tac-Toe on the Move:

# The Long and Short 'i' Game!

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## **Objective**

To raise awareness of the difference between the sounds /ɪ/ and /i:/ through fun, active, and multisensory minimal pair practice.

## **Materials**

- 9 flashcards with the following words: beans – bins – peaches – pitches – team – tin – sheep – ship – sit – seat
- A large Tic-Tac-Toe mat (or 3×3 grid made with tape on the floor)

## Sentences to Read Aloud

/i:/ sound	/ɪ/ sound
Here are <b>beans</b>	Here are <b>bins</b>
The <b>peaches</b> are amazing	The <b>pitches</b> are amazing
The <b>team</b> is new	The <b>tin</b> is new
The <b>sheep</b> is white	The <b>ship</b> is white

#### **(7)** Procedure

- 1. **Divide** the class into two teams.
- 2. Arrange the nine flashcards on the Tic-Tac-Toe mat to form a large grid.
- 3. The teacher **reads aloud** a sentence containing one of the target sounds.
- 4. One student from each team **listens carefully** and **jumps onto** the correct square the picture that matches what they heard.
- 5. The first team to get **three correct squares in a row** (horizontally, vertically, or diagonally) **wins!** \*\*P

#### Tips

- Vary the **speed**, **intonation**, or **volume** of your voice to keep learners alert.
- Encourage students to **repeat the words** after each round to reinforce pronunciation.
- If you have limited space, play the game **outdoors or in a larger area**.
- This multisensory activity helps **maintain engagement** and is especially beneficial for **students with ADHD or other neurodiverse learning profiles**.
